INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL SPELLING INVENTORY DIRECTIONS FOR ADMINISTRATION

You will administer three different levels of the Instructional Level Spelling Inventory; one below anticipated grade level, one at anticipated grade level, and one above anticipated grade level. Given that Grade 2 is the first level of the Instructional Level Spelling Inventory, students who are anticipated to be spelling at a Grade 2 level would only write the Grade 2 and Grade 3 inventory lists. Students who are anticipated to be spelling at a Grade 1 level would not take the Instructional Level Spelling Inventory as students working at a Grade 1 level are not ready to spell words that include the 25 critical features of the English spelling system.

Inventory lists should be dictated sequentially, over one or two sessions. Each word should be pronounced, used in a sentence and pronounced again. Monitor that the pace is not too fast. Many students need time to work out spellings on paper and should not be rushed. This is an inventory of knowledge, not a speed test. Students need to understand the purpose of the Spelling Inventory and how it relates to spelling instruction. Be sure to differentiate between the type of performance expectations you hold for the Spelling Inventory (non-mastery) as compared to typical spelling tests (mastery). Save the Spelling Inventories to share with parents.

Spelling Inventories should be scored by teachers. Each word is worth 4 points. Percentage equivalents are as follows:

Scores on the three Spelling Inventories should be recorded. The first level at which a student scores between 50% and 80% is the student's instructional level. This is a guideline that should be adapted according to teacher judgment about a student's spelling skills. When in doubt, always be conservative in your decisions. Students who score below 50% on the Grade 2 Spelling Inventory will likely need two years to develop Grade 2 level spelling skills. Students who score above 80% on the Grade 7 Spelling Inventory no longer need to participate in a structured spelling program.
